



SELF-GUIDED TOUR

Welcome to Suffolk University Law School in historic Boston, Massachusetts. This reference sheet is designed to guide you through our building and highlight the most interesting and impressive aspects of the facility.

The 1st floor: Begin your tour in the Great Hall, a space bustling with student activity during the school year. On the 1st floor, you will see several administrative offices, including Law Admission. This floor is also home to our many experiential learning opportunity offices, including our nationally-ranked clinical programs, where third-year law students work as state-certified student attorneys representing indigent clients in a number of legal areas, and our innovative Accelerator-to-Practice program, where students learn the business, marketing, and technology aspects of running a community-based law practice as well as client representation. You can also find the Academic Services Office, who support course enrollment, on the 1st floor. Our Professional & Career Development Office, which assigns students an Attorney Advisor from day one of their legal education, is also located on the 1st floor. If you want to purchase Suffolk merchandise, you can find the bookstore on the first floor as well.

The 2nd and 3rd floors: On the 2nd and 3rd floors you will find all of the law school classrooms, varying in size and setup. Each classroom embeds technology in its design to optimize student learning. Our advanced multimedia classrooms range in size from small seminar rooms to tiered, horseshoe-shaped lecture halls and seat between 6 and 120 students. The entire building, including all classrooms, is WiFi-enabled. In this environment, faculty can easily incorporate teleconferencing and Web-based instruction into any course curriculum, and students have instant access to worldwide information databases. Please feel free to roam the second and third floors to get a feel for our state-of-the-art classrooms.

The 2nd and 3rd floors also house Faculty Suites, where faculty members have offices and meet with students. Suffolk Law students are encouraged to meet with their professors regularly, and our building provides easy access to their offices. Finally, you may notice the locker areas on the 2nd and 3rd floors (as well as the 1st floor.) Lockers are available at no cost to our students and are assigned prior to orientation.

The 4th floor: The 4th floor houses a variety of offices. This floor has three moot courtrooms, with our largest moot courtroom, the Hon. Walter J. McLaughlin Moot Courtroom, being located in Room 425, straight across from the Rotunda area. This courtroom is used for various trial advocacy courses, mock trial competitions, and even real-life motion sessions, which occur periodically throughout the year. Students interested in trial work should know that we offer many opportunities to hone oral advocacy skills, including participating in our national trial team, consistently ranked top in the nation, our clinical programs, where students represent real clients in Boston-area courthouses, and mock trial teams in areas ranging from tax law to international law to health law. You will also find the Dean's Suite in the rotunda, which houses the Dean of Students' office. The 5th floor also has a dining hall, which has hours to accommodate both day and evening students. Along the back hallway are office spaces for our five law journals and our Student Bar Association, which oversees approximately fifty student groups.

The 5th floor: This floor is the home of the Sawyer Business School's Graduate Program. This space includes faculty offices, classrooms, and study space. Graduate and law students are welcome to use this collaborative area together.

The 6th and 7th floors: The 6th floor is home to the Student Computer Lab and has the entrance to the John Joseph Moakley Law Library, which continues onto the 7th floor. Enter the law library and explore our Main Reading Room, straight ahead, with breathtaking views of the state house and Boston Common. Feel free to wander through the book stacks on both floors to find student carrels and study spaces. The Moakley Library is perhaps the finest example in Sargent Hall of the flawless blending of the solemnity of the law with the technology of the future. Beneath all of the grandeur is an advanced network giving our students access to legal research right at their fingertips. Across from the library entrance, you will find our IT Support Desk. The IT team can assist students in addressing various technical issues.
